HISTORICAL FUNDING & SPONSORS

- 50.000 euros per EU scholarship student for the entire 2-year programme. +/- 3 IOC scholarships per cohort. Due to be renewed in 2023.
- EU funding received for edition MAiSI 1 (= cohorts 1, 2 and 3 / 2017-2021): 3 million euros and a further financing round for cohorts 4, 5, 6 and 7 (2020-2025).
 EU funding has been the largest donor.
- IN TOTAL: approximately 6.6 million euros and some private scholarships.
- Self-funding students. They have increased significantly over the years.
- Our long-term aim is to become self-sufficient.

DAISI DOCTORAL TRAINING NETWORK IN SPORT ETHICS AND INTEGRITY

A consortium led by iCERIS (interdisciplinary Centre for Ethics, Regulation and Integrity in Sport) members Prof. Dr. Mike McNamee and Prof. Dr. Thomas Könecke (Faculty of Movement and Rehabilitation Sciences / FaBeR) has secured 5 million Euros for the DoctorAl Training Network in Sport Ethics and Integrity (DAiSI). This follows on from their successful grants 2017-21; and 2021-25 for the world's first Master Programme in Sport Ethics and Integrity (MAiSI). The funding will be provided by the European Union's MSCA Doctoral Networks funding scheme (3.1 million Euros), the Swiss State Secretariat for Education, Research and Innovation (SERI) (910.000 Euros), and the UK Government (940.000 Euros)

COOPERATION

DAiSI is an interdisciplinary network comprised of 5 prestigious universities:

KU Leuven (Belgium, lead), Johannes Gutenberg University Mainz (Germany), Norwegian School of Sport Sciences (Norway), Swansea University (Wales) and University of Lausanne (Switzerland) and 7 leading international sport federations,

sport organisations and non-governmental organisations: Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU), Biathlon Integrity Unit (BIU), International Federation of Football Associations (FIFA), International Olympic Committee (IOC), Union of European Football Associations (UEFA), United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

























RESEARCH DOMAINS

DAiSI's research domains include cheating, doping, match-fixing, data protection, sexual harassment and abuse, credibility, reputation and integrity management.

CALENDAR

The network will provide extensive training and interdisciplinary doctoral education to 17 doctoral researchers between October 2023 and September 2027.
